NOTICE OF RACE

1.0 RULES

The Regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in the Racing Rules of Sailing (2017-2020 (RRS), the Sailing Instructions and the rules of the Sprint 15 and Cherub class associations. The Organising Authority is the Isle Of Sheppey Sailing Club (IOSSC) race committee. In the event of any conflict, the Sailing Instructions, shall apply.

2.0 ADVERTISING

Boats may be required to display advertising chosen and supplied by the organising authority.

3.0 ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

The entry is open to all registered Sprint 15s or Cherubs sailed by helms and crews who are members or affiliates of their respective class association. Where required by Class Association rules, at registration competitors may be required to show a valid measurement certificate for their boat, and evidence of their affiliated organisation. Entries shall be made using the event entry form and accompanied by the entry fee with a cheque payable to "IOSSC". **Fees will be £30 per Sprint 15 (or £15 for entrants who are 18 or under on 1 Jan 2019) and £40 per Cherub.** All Helms and Crews who are under 18 years of age must submit declarations signed by their Parent or Guardian.

4.0 EVENT SCHEDULE

Competitors shall register with the Race Office at IOSSC from 0830 on Saturday. A briefing will be held at approximately 1030. Three races are scheduled for first day and three for the second. The Warning Signal for the first race on Saturday will be not before 1155.

The Warning Signal for the first race on Sunday will be at 1055.

The Sprint 15's are programmed to start first and the Cherubs second, there will be a minute gap between the first fleet start signal and the first warning signal of the second fleet.

5.0 MEASUREMENT

Each boat requires a valid Measurement Certificate, which should be shown at the Event Registration. No formal pre-event measurement will take place; however, a check measurement may occur during the event.

6.0 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

For the Sprint 15s, the following PY numbers will apply:

Sprint 15 Una Rig or 2 up	PY 926
Sprint 15 Sport	PY 894

Sailing Instructions will be issued at the Event Registration. A draft version may be available for download from the Club website in advance of the event.

7.0 VENUE

The event will be held at the Isle Of Sheppey Sailing Club, Marine Parade, Sheerness Kent ME12 2BE.

8.0 COURSES

The course sailed by the Sprint 15's will be a Trapezoid with all marks left to port, and the Cherubs will sail a windward leeward course in accordance with the Sailing Instructions.

9.0 PENALTY SYSTEM

Penalties shall be in accordance with RRS 44 excluding 44.3

10.0 SCORING

The low points scoring system of RRS Appendix A4 will apply. 2 races are required to be completed to constitute a series.

If 3 races or more are completed, 1 discard will apply. For fewer than 3 races, all will count.

11.0 PRIVATE SUPPORT BOATS

Support boats shall register at the Race Office during registration period. During racing, support boats shall remain more than 100 meters from the course area, except when asked to assist by the Race Committee, or by explicit permission from the Race Committee.

12.0 PRIZES

Prizes will be awarded in the Club House as soon as possible after racing on Sunday 19th May. The prize table will be as follow:

Sprint 15's

Prizes from 1st to 6th

Cherubs

Prizes from 1st to 3rd

13.0 DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See RRS rule 4, Decision to Race. The organising authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury, or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during or after the regatta.

14.0 INSURANCE

Boats are required to be adequately insured including insurance against third party claims of at least £2m.

15.0 SAFTEY REGULATIONS

Competitors shall wear personal flotation devices at all times whilst afloat, except briefly while changing or adjusting clothing or personal equipment. Wet suits and dry suits are not personal flotation devices.
